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

Special Education Department, Government of the Punjab is mandated to provide quality special education to children with special needs in a safe and secure environment. The Department is endeavoring hard to achieve its goals and objectives by providing education, training, rehabilitation and vocational skills to special students through a network of 303-Special Education Institutions across Punjab wherein 39,450-special students of five categories i.e. Hearing Impaired, Visually Impaired, Physical Handicapped, Intellectually Disabled and Slow Learners are enrolled.





# 3. Justification of Installation of CCLY Cameras

- Department intends to implement a security surveillance system for 16,830 special students in 137 institutes of 15 districts of above mentioned 04 divisions so as to ensure safety & wellbeing of special students, staff & visitors in order to prevent unauthorized access, deter vandalism & violence.
- Plan of work by PITB will be implemented through implementation vendor (selected after open bidding competitive process) & project staff for Installation of 2MP cameras covering classrooms, corridors and key outdoor spaces and average 30 cameras per school is estimated, based on the classrooms and facilities data entered by the schools in sesis.punjab.gov.pk
- Provisioning of internet connectivity, LCDs, UPS in few schools missing these facilities for surveillance at school principal level. Local storage of at least last 7 days' video recording of cameras installed through this initiative.
- Therefore,01 Programme Manager and 4 program officers are being proposed for the
  effective execution of the project. Programme Manager would timely execute the project
  deliverables and will be responsible for all the project activities as per the scope outlined in
  the PC-1.

Ultimately, surveillance system will contribute to foster a supportive and protective educational environment for all students in special education institutions.

- Improved video surveillance of key locations within school premises.
- Availability of surveillance videos of last 7 days at school.
- Ability to select archived video recording of any school, and any timeframe during the last
   7 days
