#### 9. Approval History:-

The Department submitted the PC-I for out sourcing of **982** additional BHUs. The proposal was discussed in the PDWP meeting held on **21-02-2025** and was approved, subject to Cabinet approval with the following decisions:-

- The scheme was discussed in 66<sup>th</sup> PDWP meeting on 21.02.2025 wherein the forum initially approved two components i.e. service delivery and outsourcing of call agents services worth Rs. 8,013.128 million and Rs. 80.360 million respectively
- ii. The department must develop a robust and comprehensive monitoring mechanism and submit to P&DB for deliberations in PDWP.
- iii. The department must outline a plan regarding the future of existing staff at BHUs, including options of reassignments in the prescribed manner.

iv. The contract may include heavy penalties in case of defaults, introduction of fake data by the service provider and breach of the terms of contract. Moreover, the devised system would also identify the low performers, in order to cancel the contract, based on decline in the average footfall of the patients, as provided amongst the contract clauses.

#### 10. Reasons for Revision:-

The department has submitted the revised PC-I at a cost of **Rs. 9,263.212 million** due to the following reasons:

- HR component
- Operations & Management
- Installation of Solar and CCTV at MNHC (One Time)
- Training / Orientation Sessions
- Deletion of Monitoring Plan

## 11. Implementation Plan:-

After approval of instant PC-1, the procurement of CCTV/solar equipment is planned to be completed by May 2025. Training/orientation sessions are scheduled to be completed by June 2025. The operations of outsourced BHUs will be managed under the current PC-1 from June 2025 to June 2026, as shown below:-

#### PART – B

A Pre-PDWP meeting was held on 14-04-2025 under the Chairmanship of Member (HNP). The following observations, already conveyed to AD, were discussed in detail, however, the annotated replies are still awaited:

- i. Department has submitted amended PC-I at a cost of Rs. 9,263.212 million, contrary to the directions of PDWP regarding submission of a robust and comprehensive monitoring mechanism and submit to P&DB for deliberations in PDWP. Department may explain the same.
- ii. Department has proposed some additional posts which need to be justified.
- iii. As Department has deleted the provision for Command and Control then why same was included in the PC-I.
- iv. Department has included additional 10 vehicles (1350 CC) for Planning Officer which needs to be justified with entitlement as per government policy, existing facilities and why these are included at this stage.
- v. Why gestation period enhanced to 29 month as discussed in PDWP with 20 months.

After detailed discussion in the meeting, it was recommended as under:-

i. The department has submitted a revised PC-I at a cost of **Rs. 9,263.212** million after deleting monitoring component as the department has developed

- a separate monitoring framework for the entire Health Department and discussed in DDSC. The department may explain the reasons and place the monitoring plan before the PDWP for deliberations in compliance with its earlier directions.
- ii. As there is no field staff under this PC-I, therefore, provision of 03 vehicles (2800 cc), and 36-vehicles (1350 cc), is not justified for monitoring purposes. Additionally, the allocation of 10 other vehicles (1350 cc) for office staff is unjustified, considering the lump sum package. However, 06 vehicles of 1350cc, with a total cost of Rs. 27.60 million are recommended for inspection purpose.
- iii. The department initially proposed 21 staff positions for PMU; however, after detailed deliberations, it was agreed that 19 PMU staff positions may be presented before PDWP for considerations as under:
